

The establishments of this industry group provide a combination of the following network activities: local pickup, local sorting and terminal operations, line-haul, destination sorting and terminal operations, and local delivery.

They are not specialized in handling bulk products of any particular type, size, or quantity of goods or products.






Development of Alabama's Distribution Center Industry by Company



Total Wages by NAICS Code 2000-2013








2013 Average Annual Employment by Age Group


2013 Average Annual Employment by Age Group


2013 Average Annual Employment by Age Group
