GOVERNOR'S WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT DIRECTIVE NO. PY2007-06, Change 5

SUBJECT: Program Year 2008 WIA Youth, Adult, and Dislocated Worker Allocations

1. **Purpose.** This Directive transmits notice of State Level Fiscal Year 2009 Rapid Response funds made available to the Alabama Workforce Investment Area.

2. **Discussion.** The WIA Implementing Regulations (20 CFR665.340) allow for Rapid Response funds to be awarded (if any funds are still available after the state's Rapid Response requirements are met) to local areas that experience mass layoffs, plant closings, natural disasters, or other events if there are not adequate local dislocated worker funds to provide intensive, training, and other services. Based upon the request of December 19, 2008 (attached), which addresses services for dislocated workers, obligation and expenditure issues, and the fact that the state has sufficient funds to meet its Rapid Response requirements, it appears that all criteria have been met for a special award of these funds to be made to the Alabama Workforce Investment Area. The amount of Rapid Response funds being made available is \$162,000 from our Fiscal Year 2009 WIA Rapid Response funds. The spending authority ends on June 30, 2011 for these funds.

The funds must be budgeted separately and expenditures reported as Fiscal Year 2009 Rapid Response expenditures. A plan budget modification will also be required for these funds.

3. **Action.** The PY08/FY09 Planning Allocation has been revised to include these changes and is Attachment 1 to this Directive. Please retain it for future reference.

SUBJECT: December 19, 2008 Request for Special Allocation of Workforce
Investment Act (WIA) State Level Rapid Response Funds

As you're aware, the WIA Implementing Regulations (20 CFR665.340) allow for Rapid Response funds to be awarded (if any funds are still available after the state's Rapid Response requirements are met) to local areas that experience mass layoffs, plant closings, natural disasters, or other events if there are not adequate local dislocated worker funds to provide intensive, training, and other services. Based upon your request of December 19, 2008 (attached), which addresses services for dislocated workers, obligation and expenditure issues, and the fact that the state has sufficient funds to meet its Rapid Response requirements, it appears that all criteria have been met for a special award of these funds to be made to the Alabama Workforce Investment Area. The amount of Rapid Response funds being made available is \$162,000 from our Fiscal Year 2009 WIA Rapid Response funds. The spending authority ends on June 30, 2011 for these funds.

The funds must be separately budgeted and expenditures reported as Rapid Response expenditures. Therefore, it may be necessary for you to establish new ITA project numbers for fund source "K." Rapid Response funds were made available to the AWIA in January 2008, so you may want to review the procedures required at that time. A plan budget modification will also be required for these funds.

Hopefully, this allocation will be sufficient to preclude the need for the local area to reduce or curtail services to dislocated workers. If you should have any questions, please contact me at (334) 242-5300.

The Alabama Workforce Investment Area (AWIA) has sustained numerous job losses over the past several months, with plant after plant announcing major employee layoffs and plant closures. Today Delphi Steering Systems announced the closure of their plant in Limestone County with the layoff of 1020 workers by June 30, 2009.

In order to better serve the needs of both the growing number of dislocated workers as well as currently unemployed and/or underemployed within the 65 county workforce area I request the transfer of any remaining State Rapid Response WIA monies that could be utilized by the AWIA to provide supportive and training services to this ever expanding population of dislocated workers.
