TECH ACCELERATOR PROGRAM

Under Article 19 of Chapter 18 of Title 40, *Code of Alabama 1975*, as amended, an Economic Development Organization (“EDO”) may apply to have a **tech accelerator program** project be considered for funding under the Growing Alabama program.

A **tech accelerator program** encourages the creation, operation, or support of technology companies in Alabama.

A tech accelerator program is defined as a program lasting not more than twelve months. An “accelerator” is defined as a company which, for a fixed term not more than six months, educates and mentors early-stage technology companies recruited to a location in Alabama, with the goal of accelerating such companies’ development and growth.

Growing Alabama projects are funded through taxpayer contributions. Taxpayers receive an income tax credit in the amount of their contribution.
